Billionaire MacKenzie Scott makes \$5M donation toward new Boys & Girls Clubs facility

Billionaire MacKenzie Scott, one of the wealthiest women in the world, made a \$4.8 million donation toward a new facility for the Boys & Girls Clubs of Miami-Dade

The nonprofit, which serves predominately African-American children from lower-income families, said the donation will help replace its 69-year-old Northwest Club community center at 10915 N.W. 14th Ave. The new facility would total 25,000 square feet and include a learning center, a STEM/computer lab, a teen center and recreational areas. The fields and the gym would also be refurbished.

The Boys & Girls Club said the \$13 million project would break ground in 2023. The aim of the program is to help children prepare for educational success and good jobs.

"We are incredibly grateful and humbled by MacKenzie Scott's generosity to select us for such a transformational gift to support great futures for our area youth," said Alex Rodriguez-Roig, president of Boys & Girls Clubs of Miami-Dade. "The Club's positive programs are very important to keeping our youth members engaged in a healthy, safe, productive, and enjoyable environment."

An author and philanthropist, Scott is the ex-wife of Amazon.com founder <u>Jeff</u> <u>Bezos</u>, who grew up in Miami-Dade County. She joined the Giving Pledge in 2019 and has given billions of dollars to nonprofit organizations, including major donations to South Florida universities in 2021.

The new gift was part of \$281 million that Scott donated to numerous Boys & Girls Clubs across the country. That was the largest gift in the history of the organization.
